It is designed to review and reinforce the use of vocabulary and grammar rules in order for the students to be able to understand and to express themselves orally and in written Standard Arabic with confidence and ease. Emphasis will also be made on developing reading, comprehension as well as the listening and conversational skills.

2. الأهداف الدراسية لهذا الفصل الدراسي

By the end of this semester, students will be expected to perform at the Advanced Low to Advance Mid level of proficiency in Arabic based on the *ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines 2012*. This means that students will be expected to do the following:

- 1. In the "speaking" area of the language:
 - a. Manage to converse with confidence about informal topics related to school, home, and recreation, as well as some formal topics related to current events and matters of public interest.
 - b. Handle conversation about a substantial number of topics related to daily life.
 - c. Narrate and describe using connected discourse and present, past, and future time frames.
 - d. Ask and respond to a variety of questions or requests for information.
 - e. Can handle successfully and with relative ease the linguistic challenges presented by a complication or unexpected turn of events that occurs within the context of a routine situation or communicative task with which they are otherwise familiar.
- 2. In the "writing" area of the language:
 - a. Write cohesive paragraphs about personal preferences, daily routines, common events, and other personal topics.
 - b. Write compositions and summaries on topics of general interest.
 - c. Write detailed narratives and descriptions in all time frames.
- 3. In the "listening" area of the language:
 - a. Understand main facts and main supporting details in conventional narrative and descriptive texts, such as expanded descriptions of persons, places, and things, and narrations about past, present, and future events.
 - b. Manage to derive substantial meaning from connected texts dealing with familiar and some unfamiliar topics.
- 4. In the "reading" area of the language:
 - a. Understand fully and with ease texts that deal with personal and social topics.
 - b. Understand fully and with ease conventional narrative and descriptive texts of any length, as well as more complex factual material.
 - c. Derive comprehension not only from situational and subject-matter knowledge but also from knowledge of the language itself.

Canvas: All assignments, announcements, exercises, study guides, grades and other materials will be posted on the course page on Canvas. It is your responsibility to check the page regularly and keep up with all materials and announcements that will be posted.

Attendance: This is not a virtual class. Becoming fluent in a language requires extensive, repeated exposure to that language. A student who misses 4 sessions or more without a documented excuse will receive a failing grade. For more details, please refer to the following website:
