**COURSE OBJECTIVES:** Review of advanced French grammar; practice of writing in French (compositions, summaries of texts); practice of reading and comprehension of French literary, journalistic, and audiovisual materials.

**HOMEWORK 1 and 2**: On October 11 and November 3, you will upload your responses to the questions on the reading by Nothomb <u>before the class starts</u> (in Canvas or to <u>bweltman@ufl.edu</u>). Find the questions and follow the instructions provided in the reading guide for the day or Assignments in Canvas. I will not grade the homework assignments, but I will provide feedback. Completing these homework assignments will count toward your PARTICIPATION grade.

<u>Optional:</u> If you would like to submit other homework for individual feedback, please send it to me before the class covering the material.

**EXAMS** will be based on the grammatical structures covered; they will also include Comprehension exercises based on the chapters in Nothomb's *Métaphysique des tubes* studied together, or on a short text; and a short composition. More details will be provided before each exam.

**<u>COMPOSITIONS</u>**: In addition to short compositions in Exams, you will write 5 Compositions. You will submit 2 drafts of the first 2 compositions: the first draft will count for 70%, and the second will count for 30% of the composition's grade. You will receive my feedback after submitting the first draft. You will only submit one draft of Compositions 3, 4, and 5. More details will be provided before each composition. Please follow all instructions.
