Description:

The purpose of this course is to build on the linguistic skills acquired in the first two years of Chinese to further train students in advanced use of the language, including conversation, reading, writing and translation. In the process, students are also introduced to the contemporary Chinese society and cultural developments in its social context. Grades are based on both the level of achievement and the progress made during the course. Students are required to read both simplified and traditional texts, but may write one text of their choice.

Six lessons and three discussion topics for the fall semester-

Lesson 1 《人口大爆炸》, lesson 2 《中国第 13 亿个小公民》, lesson 4 《教育》, lesson 5 《一个初三毕业生的星期天》, lesson 8 《恋爱婚姻》and lesson 9 《一则征婚启事和应征者》.

Students will discuss issues related to population, education and marriage in the U.S. and China (pre-1949 and after).

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Passing Grade for the Major, Minor, and General Education, as well as moving to CHI 3411 Advanced Chinese 2 is C. Students who pursue a Chinese major or minor must complete the course with minimum grades of C and no optional S-U.

Course Requirements:

Attendance, Participation and Performance (10%) in class will affect your grade, but more importantly failure to attend class will seriously impair your ability to learn Chinese. Starting from the first day of class, students are allowed to have three unexcused absences. Each additional unexcused absence after the 4th will result in 1% deduction from the final grade of the course. Make-up presentations, quizzes, tests, and late homework and and late papers will NOT be accepted unless mitigating circumstances are declared, which requires appropriate documentation for consideration. Please be punctual. If you are late to class, you will not be given extra time to complete the exams and quizzes. If you are more than 5 minutes late three times without your instructor's consent, they will be counted as one absence. If you are more than 25 minutes late, it will be considered as one absence. If you leave 10 minutes prior the end of class without your instructor's permission, it is counted as one absence as well.

Participation in class discussion is important and will affect your overall grade. The vocabulary, grammar as well as the content in the assigned text will be discussed during the lecture. You will be expected to read through the text and the grammar notes before coming to class. You will be asked questions related to what you are supposed to prepare. Use of phone, tablet, computer are not allowed in class. If you use any of the electronic devices without the instructor's approval, you will receive Zero for your attendance and participation for that class.

Homework assignments (10%) (including written exercises and writing) should be completed before the beginning of class on the due date. Only hard copy of the written homework will be accepted. Homework worksheet must be printed from Canvas and completed before due date. No electronic copy or email will be accepted. Writing assignment should be posted on students' E-portforlio site. Late homework assignments will NOT be corrected and no points will be given.

Quizzes (10%): There will be a vocabulary quiz and grammar quiz for each lesson. Vocabulary quiz focuses on the writing and pronunciation for the new vocabulary of each lesson. Grammar quiz is to test how to use the new vocabulary, grammar patterns and idioms in context. No make-up quizzes will be given.

Interview and Presentation (15%): there will be one interview and one group skit. Students will choose partners to work with and present in class. More details will be given in class.

Chapter tests (43%): There will be three chapter tests for lesson 1 &2 (in traditional character), lesson 4&5(in simplified character) and lesson 8 &9 (scripts TBA). No makeup tests will be given. However, if you must miss a test due to illness or personal emergency, you are responsible for documentation.

Research 研究报告 and final presentation (Drafts 2%, presentation 3%, final paper 5%, 10% total). Students will explore one research area related to population, education and marriage in America and/or China. The topic should be specific in one area. Final paper is due on the last day of class on April 22nd. No electronic copy of research paper

will be accepted. Please print out and bring the paper copy to class. The research topic should be related to materials we have studied this semester.

Students will give a final presentation on their research paper during the last two weeks of class using PowerPoint notes. Detailed instruction will be given in class.

Character recognition: students taking this class should make efforts to read both simplified and traditional characters. They may choose to write only one version.

E-portfolio (2%)

Students will collect the written/audio/video evidence of study progress and build their own E-portfolio at www.portfolium.com. Your E-portfolio will include but does not limit to writing assignments, interview questions, presentation drafts and videos/audios of selected assignments. Students may connect their E-portforlio to personal social media account or professional account.

Makeup Policy

- A. Make-up tests, quizzes, homework, and oral presentations (individual and group) are given strictly to those with valid proof of illness, emergency and approved school activities. Official documentation must be provided for the **exact date of absence**. Pre-arranged make-ups are only for official activities, not for personal activities.
- B. In addition to an official document, the instructor must be contacted by email before the class time and a make-up section must be scheduled **within three class days** after the student's return to class. It is important not to miss the group presentations as other members in the group can be affected. **Also see Attendance**.

There will be no make-ups for any quiz, test, or oral presentation if any of the above requirements is not fulfilled.

Beginning, Intermediate, and Advanced Chinese language courses require a placement test administered by the department of Languages, Literatures, and Cultures. **Testing dates will be: Tuesday, January 7th, 2020 or Wednesday, January 8th, 2020 from 1-3 pm in 1317 Turlington Hall- Language Learning Lab.** If you do not abide by this policy and it is discovered by your instructor that you have previous background in Chinese, your instructor has the right to either place you into the appropriate level if one exists or drop you from the class rolls.
