Description du cours

Ce cours se concentre sur les approches littéraires et linguistiques du rap français à travers les études de Bettina Ghio, Sans fautes de frappe: Rap et littérature (2016) et Pas là pour plaisir! Portraits de rappeuses (2020). Le livre Sans fautes de frappe examine les aspects littéraires et linguistiques du rap tandis que Pas là pour plaisir! enquête sur la place des femmes dans le rap, révélant leur langue, leur condition et leur émancipation. Anthologie du rap français de Jousserand (2016) sert de recueil de textes de rap qui aide les étudiants à se familiariser avec des textes exemplaires du hip-hop français. Centrée sur l'histoire, la structure, le style, la culture et le lexique du rap français, ce cours explore cet univers français unique où les artistes de toutes origines développent un art qui capte les français et façonnent le langage et la pensée dans la Francophonie.

Sans fautes de frappe de Ghio (2016) explore les racines du rap chez des écrivains comme Céline, la tradition de la chanson française, et la culture populaire où le «gendarmicide» est une figure typique de l'anti autoritarisme et de l'anarchisme français. Les textes rap sur la banlieue et son béton gris, la prison, les rencontres avec la police et les blessures du colonialisme et du racisme peignent des portraits d'aliénation des immigrés vis-à-vis de l'État français et des forces de l'ordre. Les discussions portent sur le style fertile et l'imagination des rappeurs, le rappeur en poète et troubadour, les rimes comme quête de beauté et les performances de rap en direct comme poésie vécue. Le langage du rap, ses origines, ses influences, sa phonologie, son jargon et son vocabulaire, et le mépris des règles grammaticales sont des discussions centrales, tout comme les relations du rap avec les notions d'identité noire ou arabe, les expériences d'immigration et le pouvoir de réconciliation du rap.

Pas là pour plaisir! Portraits de rappeuses de Ghio (2020) explore la «face B» de l'histoire du rap français, soulevant le problème de l'invisibilité des rappeuses françaises. L'auteur examine les pionnières de la première génération comme Saliha, B-Love et Melaaz, l'incontournable deuxième génération composée de Diam's, Casey et Keny Arkana, et leurs héritières de la période actuelle comme La Gale et KT Gorique. L'auteure construit sa discussion sur des entretiens et des analyses littéraires de leurs textes. Ghio regarde les efforts de ces rappeuses pour permettre la libération des femmes à travers des textes qui dénoncent à la fois les abus patriarcaux tout en illustrant la voie de la libération. Les problèmes de sexism, les amalgamations, les préjugés, les représentations du corps féminin, et la condition et la sexualité des femmes, sont quelques thèmes centraux du livre, ainsi que le rejet des attentes de genre, l'utilisation d'images violentes, et les styles vestimentaires non genrés qui se manifestent dans les textes des rappeuses.

1. Les 5 travaux de discussion "blog" sur le rap (30% de la note finale)

- 90 points pour les blogs

- 10 points pour les réponses

Pour les 5 travaux de discussion «blog», les étudiants sont encouragés à imaginer qu'ils travaillent pour une organisation médiatique française importante et neutre. Vous n'êtes pas un initié de l'industrie cherchant à stimuler les ventes d'albums de rap, mais plutôt un critique cherchant à interpréter et juger les productions culturelles de la société française.

Pour ces 5 blogs, votre patron aimerait que vous analysiez la culture du rap français, y compris les rappeurs, leurs albums, leurs chansons les plus marquantes, les idéologies de leurs textes, leur vocabulaire et grammaire, et ce qu'elle révèle sur la société, les classes et catégories sociales et l'identité en France (y compris le sexe, l'orientation sexuelle, la race, l'ethniciété, les antécédents religieux, les capacités, etc.).

Chaque blog aura au moins 500 mots et pas plus de 700 au total. Votre objectif est d'écrire dans un style de français accessible que tout lecteur de journal pourrait comprendre. Bien entendu, vous devez citer Ghio (2016) ou (2020) afin d'apporter un support d'expertise à certaines de vos idées.

Les sujets potentiels incluent:

Un blog sur les aspects du langage rap
Un blog sur les questions de genre dans le rap
Un blog sur la race dans le rap
Un blog sur les représentations sur des albums ou des vidéos de rap
Un blog sur les aspects littéraires du rap (poétique, style, imagerie, sources)
Un blog sur l'histoire d'un rappeur ou d'un groupe de rappeurs
Un blog sur un sous-genre rap identifiable en France
Un blog sur les aspects ethnomusicologiques du rap français
Un blog sur le rap et l'immigration
Un blog sur la domination du rap dans la société française
Un blog sur le complexe industriel du rap en France
Un blog sur l'impact de la loi Toubon dans le développement du rap français
Un blog sur les réactions de l'Etat français aux paroles de rap
Un blog sur la philosophie du rap
Un blog sur les tropes ou archétypes importants des paroles de rap

Comme il s'agit d'un "blog", vous pouvez intégrer les vidéos dont vous discutez. Vous pouvez également citer des lignes de chansons de rap, mais notez que vous ne devez pas compter les citations dans votre décompte final de mots!

Réponses:

Après avoir soumis votre blog, vous aurez 7 jours pour lire les blogs de vos camarades de classe. Écrivez une réponse respectueuse et réfléchie à deux de vos camarades de classe en 50 mots.

2. Les 3 présentations (30% de la note finale)

- a. Présentation d'un album de rap
- b. Présentation sur trois vidéos de rap

c. Présentation sur une journée de lecture dans Ghio

3. Les 2 examens (20% de la note finale)

Vous aurez 70 minutes pour passer cet examen à la maison. L'examen restera ouvert pendant 24 heures. Il contiendra deux questions à développement, 10 questions à réponse courte et 10 questions vrai / faux et à choix multiples.

4. Les 4 questionnaires (10% de la note finale)

Vous aurez 10 minutes pour répondre à un quiz de 10 questions. Les questions seront vrai / faux, choix multiples et réponse courte.

5. Participation / Présence (10% de la note finale)

You are expected to attend class and to regularly participate with your randomly assigned partners. Your instructor will take attendance.
