This course is a hybrid, five-credit course, synchronous from Mondays to Thursdays and asynchronous on Fridays. **The face-to-face section meets 3 times a week, on M, T and W in classroom, and online via zoom on Thursdays and Fridays.** All students, regardless of face-to-face or online, need to sign in zoom for every single class.

In the first week, Jan 11-15, all sections will meet online only, via zoom.

Course description

This course is designed for students who have completed VTN 1130 Beginning Vietnamese I, or those with the instructor's permission. Students continue to improve and learn how to carry simple conversations in daily life situations and be able to read and write simple paragraphs. Students will work on four language skills. Short stories, poems, songs and video clips will be provided from time to time for reading and listening exercises. Expect to practice your speaking skill through class discussions and group presentations. Writing assignments are weekly. Attendance and participation are mandatory.

Course Learning Goals

- By the end of the course, students will know how to
- describe and borrow something, ask for permission or make a request, understand how to use classifiers
 - talk about weather, holidays, transportation, food, housing, inquire information.
 - make a phone call, book an appointment, do shopping, rent a place, ask for and give directions.

General note: Any component of this syllabus may be *modified* during the semester to accommodate pedagogical needs and student progress.

Class notes If you miss a class, check **with your classmates** the materials covered in that class.

Quizzes, exams Exams and short quizzes are given during regular class hours. Five quizzes are pop-up. *There are no make-up quizzes or exams.* A grade of zero will be assigned to any missed quiz or exam unless you provide **documented medical/emergency reasons**, then the grade for a missing quiz or exam will be prorated at the end of the course. If you had technical issues and cannot login for class that day, please email me as soon as possible.

Homework and essays **Late homework will NOT be graded.** Do not miss any submission. **Six points will be deducted for each missing homework, and 10 points for each missing essay.**

Presentations Three or four students form a study group. Members in each group work together and support one another during the term. **Fridays** are group work via zoom. There are two presentations during the term (5% and 10%). Topics for the first presentation (about 5-8 minutes long) are chosen by the group and approved by the instructor. For the second presentation (about 10-15 minutes long), the topic is assigned by the instructor. Presentations are your verbal tests.

Everyone is expected to attend and participate in all presentations. Asking questions is a part of your presentation's grade. All members of the group will receive the same grade.

Participation **BE VISIBLE** and contribute to class discussions. **Ask questions. Offer answers and comments.**

An **A grade** requires the student to be active in daily class discussions, such as commenting and/or asking meaningful questions that contribute to the understanding of the lessons, voluntarily offering answers, or fully participating in group discussions in class. A **B grade** is all of the above, but at a lesser degree.

Very little or no participating in class discussions results in a **C-and-below grade** in this category.

Office hours At any moment during the term, if you feel confused about anything, please come to my office. If you cannot make it during office hours, email me a few options and I will find the time to be available for you. Do NOT wait until late in the course to catch up.

Attendance policy and email etiquette

Absences due to illness, special curricular requirements including technical issues, or emergency are excused, **and paper documentation is expected** (e.g., a letter from a doctor/infirmarary/clinic, police report, receipts for car repair, court orders, funeral arrangements, conferences, job interviews, etc.). Religious holidays are excused. “A student should inform the faculty member of the religious observances of his or her faith that will conflict with class attendance, with tests or examinations, or with other class activities prior to the class or occurrence of that test or activity”. You are allowed **two unexcused absences**; having more than two will affect your total grade: deduction of **0.5 %** (2 pts) from the total grade for each absence without a documented medical reason. **Missing 14 or more classes might result in failing the course. Repeated tardiness** will also reduce your grade. In the event you must miss class, please contact the instructor **prior** to the class meeting and have your absence pre-approved, except for documented emergency.

RUBRICS

QUIZZES, EXAMS, HOMEWORK, ESSAYS

Late homework will NOT be graded. Six points will be deducted for each missing homework, and 10 points for each missing essay.

Spelling mistakes

Depending on students’ language background, 1 point will be deducted for every 2 or 3 spelling mistakes. Vocabulary usage and grammatical mistakes cost no points.

Grammatical and vocabulary mistakes: Quizzes, Exams only

Every mistake costs 1-2 pt. depending on seriousness.

PRESENTATIONS

An A-presentation starts with a summary in Vietnamese; members do not read from a written script but speak. Presentation uses only Vietnamese, no English translation; new vocabulary is kept to a minimum and explained when occurred; uses simple and correct sentences, images, videos, etc....to make sure everyone in class can understand; applies grammatical points and the vocabulary learned during the term as much as you can; no spelling mistakes, no grammatical mistakes; every member in the group shares the responsibility in the final draft of the whole presentation (e.g., check for spelling/grammatical mistakes); everyone understands and answers questions from the audience.

A B-presentation has all of requirements for A presentation but at a lesser degree; uses some English to explain the vocabulary; may have a few minor grammatical mistakes, or some spelling mistakes; some members still read from the script from time to time.

A C-and-below presentation regularly relies on English for explanations and/or understanding the questions; most or all members read from the script; translates the sentences to English. Presentation contains spelling mistakes, members in the group did not work together (e.g., mistakes in spelling and grammatical constructions, or in the use of vocabulary).
